2023/24 Academic Year: The tuition fee for this course will be GBP 26000.00.

The tuition fee will remain the same for every year of study.

Most international students will need to obtain a visa via the new Student Route to study in the UK. For attendance of less than six months duration, students may be able to obtain a Standard Visitor Visa. This offer is not a confirmation of your eligibility for a visa. In the event that you accept and satisfy any conditions set out in this offer you will be invited to complete a Right to Study check. Following completion of this check, a confirmation of acceptance for studies (CAS) or a letter to support your Standard Visitor Visa application will be sent to you as appropriate. The University reserves the right to refuse admission should you arrive after the latest date for acceptance onto the course specified in your CAS.

This course requires payment of an acceptance deposit GBP 1000.00 to secure your place. This amount will be deducted from the overall tuition fee for the course. You can make a payment by visiting Paying Fees. Your offer will be automatically accepted on your behalf

following payment of your deposit. If you have paid via MyManchester your status in self-service will usually update within 48 hours. This may take slightly longer if you have paid via another means or have provided evidence of sponsorship. Please note that this deposit is non-refundable except in specific circumstances.
